## Rent Check!

**Rick Caruso's 8500 Burton Way** (just a stone's throw from the developer's original contribution to the L.A. landscape, Loehmann's) will take the notion of apartment rentals to new heights. The eight-story building, designed by Irvine-based MVE & Partners with interiors by San Francisco firm BAMO, offers 87 one- and two-bedroom units and one mega-penthouse. Entry level? The smallest units are just more than

800 square feet and start in the high \$3,000s. Amenities include dog walking services, a valet pass to The Grove and The Americana at Brand and delivery services from Trader Joe's, located in the building's ground floor. And come December, **Caroline Styne** and **Suzanne Goin** (AOC, Lucques, Tavern) will open The Larder on Burton Way, also on the ground floor, with room service to all residents. The cherry on top? The 4,000-square-foot penthouse unit, designed by **Waldo Fernandez**, will go for a cool \$35,000 a month. —AAM
